an insight into Estonian reality of homelessness

Reality

 There are more homeless people in Estonia than ever before.

 Due to the financial crisis new groups of homeless peole are found (e.g. elderly people, single mothers, young people). No one knows the exact number.

 There are many of them who do not even have an Estonian passport.

 The problem is more actual and visible in the capital (Tallinn).

Facts

- Average age among adults is 46 years.
- Average age among children is 8 years.
- 65,1% are men
- 34,9% are women
- 66,4% do not speak Estonian

Main reasons for homelessness are:

-losing the apartment (22,4%)

- losing the family (18%)

- difficulties in paying rent (18%)

ATTITUDE

- An average Estonian finds nothing in common with homelessness.
- The people who find their food from the junk or who froze to death at winter seem to be like from another planet.

- This attitude is mostly thanks to our media.
- It tends to forget that a homeless person is a human too!
- In newspapers or on tv they never use the name of the homeless person when something happens.
- They lose their right to be an individual.

ANY HOPE?

 Many of them believe that finding a job could put them on their feet again.

 Research has shown that when it does not happen during the first year after losing job/ home the percentage to find a job is down to zero.

- Unfortunately in Estonia our employment policy means that once you are off the track it is almost impossible to find the way back.
- Our system does not have active methods for homeless people to bring them back to work.
- So far all the hope ends when you get a place in the shelter and that is it.
- In the morning everything starts all over again.

- More effort should be put into prevention, rehabilitation and integration.
- Enormous lack of information between the people who need help and these who could help.
- We have to increase the awareness about our rights, possibilities and choices.

IMPORTANT

Reality is that more than 600
accomodation places are needed asap for people who wait on lists for a shelter at the moment.

 Most important is to change the attitude towards homeless people and to understand that everyone has a right to a decent life!
