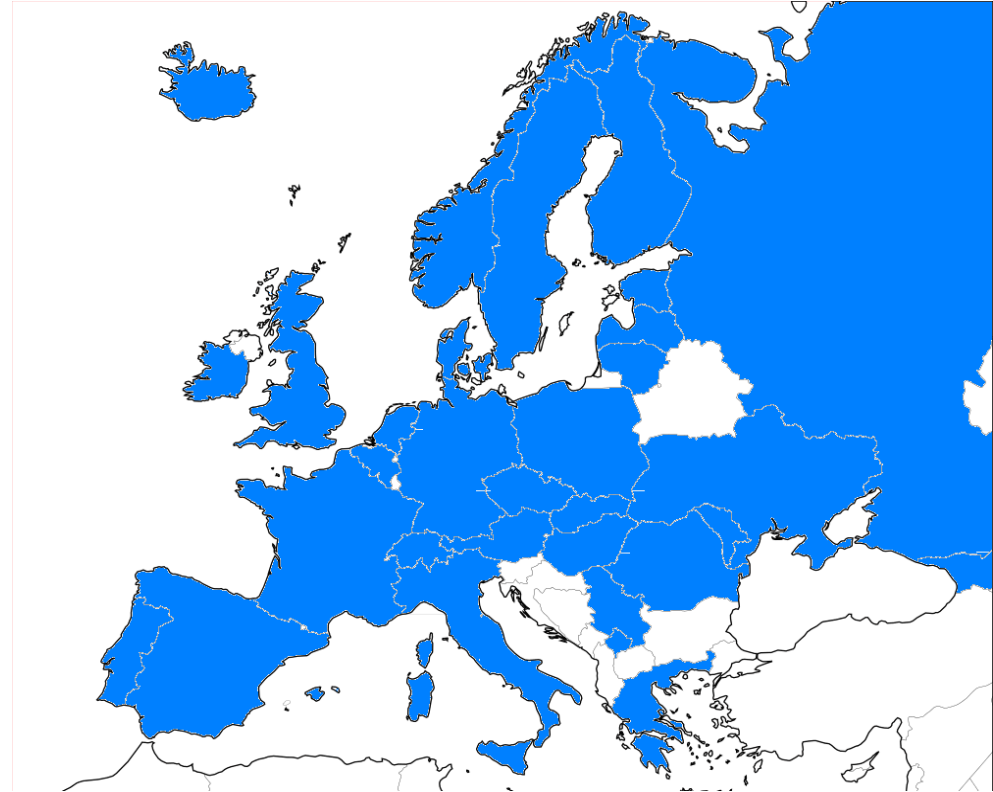

- Platform of Christian value-based providers of social and healthcare services
- Diaconal departments of churches, church-affiliated organisations, independent NGOs
- 44 Members, 33 countries



Benefits for EOs

- ◆ Information exchange

Get fuller picture of the situation in our own members' countries

- ◆ Partnerships

Link own members to national networks (if these links are not already existing)



Challenges for EOs

- **Weaker advocacy focus (Eurodiaconia, Salvation Army)**

General prioritisation of providing services over lobbying and campaigning
→ limited engagement with European Semester and other policy tools

- **Lack of detailed, country-specific knowledge**

Ability to provide trans-national overviews already covered by EAPN secretariat?

- **Limited role in preparing EU ISG meetings**

Proposals for discussion topics, presentations on work done by EOs



Contributions from EOs

- ◆ Complement national input
 - Particularly for organisations with a strong thematic focus (Eurochild, AGE, FEANTSA)
 - Broaden the representativity of EAPN policy positions and recommendations
- ◆ Create new partnerships
- ◆ Support EU-level action
 - Provide additional EU contacts
 - Brainstorming about effective EU-level action
 - 'External' point of view on EAPN policy and advocacy work
