- **Concentration of prior target groups**
  - Youth and young adults
  - Long term unemployed persons
  - Migrants
  - Staff and enterprises (SME)
- **Concentration of the federal OP**
  - Federal ESF programmes cutted in half (from 62 to 26), across five ministries: social affairs and labour market (8), economy (5), family-youth-seniors (6), education (5), environment (2)
- **Mixture from new and established ESF-programmes**

## Thematic objectives and investment priorities (IP)



### **Prio. A / Thematic objective: promoting sustainable and quality employment and supporting labour mobility**

IP a (iii): Self-employment, entrepreneurship and business creation including innovative micro, small and medium sized enterprises

IP: a (iv) Equality between men and women in all areas, including in access to employment, career progression, reconciliation of work and private life and promotion of equal pay for equal work

IP: a (v) Adaptation of workers, enterprises and entrepreneurs to change (partnership programm rückenwind II)

### **Prio. B / Thematic objective: promoting social inclusion, combating poverty and any discrimination**

IP: b (i) Active inclusion, including with a view to promoting equal opportunities and active participation, and improving employability

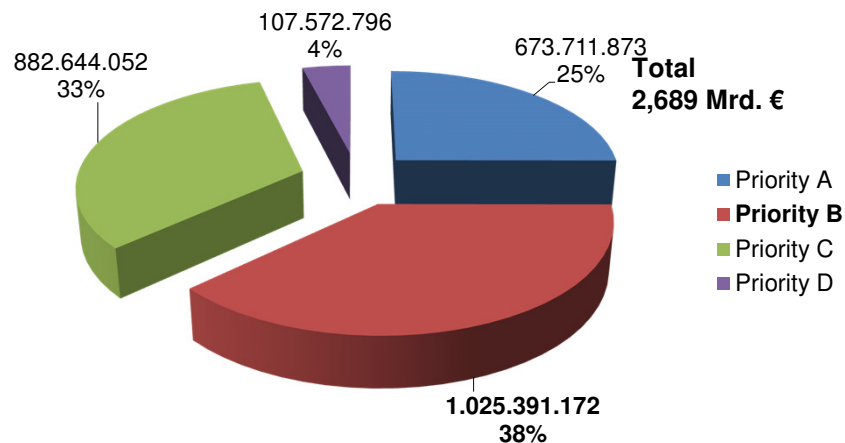
### Prio. C / Thematic objective: investing in education, training and vocational training for skills and life-long learning:

IP: c (iii) Enhancing equal access to lifelong learning for all age groups in formal, non-formal and informal settings, upgrading the knowledge, skills and competences of the workforce, and promoting flexible learning pathways including through career guidance and validation of acquired competences

IP: c (iv) Improving the labour market relevance of education and training systems, facilitating the transition from education to work, and strengthening vocational education and training systems and their quality, including through mechanisms for skills anticipation, adaptation of curricula and the establishment and development of work-based learning systems, including dual learning systems and apprenticeship schemes

**Subprograms**

- Integration of 30.000 long term (> 2 years) unemployed persons (> 27 years old) without useful professional education into the first labour market; specific target groups: migrants and old employees
- Professional language support for migrants

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**Thematic objectives and  
investment priorities (IP)  
Social inclusion**



**Subprograms**

- Integration guideline for migrants and refugees
  - Integration instead exclusion: disadvantaged < 27 years old persons to find a professional training place or to make / finalize a school degree
  - Integration by exchange: disadvantaged < 27 years old persons participate in a transnational measure to find a professional training place or to finalize a school degree
  - Integration of refugees and asylum seekers to find a professional training place or to make a school degree

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## Thematic objectives and investment priorities (IP) Social inclusion



### Subprograms

- Strengthening youth in quarters: disadvantaged < 27 years old persons (youth and young adults) are supported for the workforce
- Education, Economy, Work in the Neighborhood: the program supports projects on integrating people (long term unemployed or migrants > 27 years old) into the workforce and strengthening the local economy

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## Fund for European Aid to the Most Deprived: FEAD



- ESIF is oriented on the integration into the labour market. The described issues below ‚social inclusion‘ within the ESF is related in this pathway too.
- EHAP was planned original as a funds for food support. Due different interventions on European and national level another addressed priority is now possible: **social inclusion**
- By the development of the OP and the guide line in Germany the partnership approach would be used
- Germany addresses an OP for social cohesion and to fight poverty
- Clear boundary to the ESF: social outcome indicator: participation in the society

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## Realisation of the EHAP in Germany



- DE takes 78,9 Mio. € from the EHAP and puts 9,33 Mio. € own fund into the programme to fight poverty especially of **immigrants and homeless persons**
- Intervention rate: 85 % EHAP plus 10 % federal own fund (own fund: 5 %)
- KOM-approval of the OP: 25.02.2015
- Starting of the first call: in 07 / 2015
- Project funding: 11 / 2015
